Colleges, primary and secondary schools will remain open only for vulnerable children and the children of critical workers. All other children will learn remotely until February half term.

Social distancing (2m) is mandatory in public. Face coverings are required by law to be worn in many indoor settings, such as shops or places of worship where these remain open, and on public transport.

It is against the law to meet socially with family or friends unless they are part of your household or support bubble.

It is allowed to exercise within one household (or support bubble) or with one other person, this should be limited to once per day, and should not involve travel outside of one's local area.

Shops are open with restrictions that are varying between regions.

Social distancing is mandatory in public. Wearing a mask is mandatory indoors in public spaces. Maximum size of gatherings is 6-10 people varying between regions. Curfew begins between the hours of 22:00 and 00:00 and ends between 5:00 and 7:00

Outdoor exercise allowed in every region with a maximum group size of 6-10 varying between regions.

Open with restrictions

Eight pieces of legislation—Royal Decree-Law 6/2020, Royal Decree-Law 7/2020, Royal Decree 463/2020, Royal Decree-Law 8/2020, Royal Decree 465/2020, Royal Decree-Law 9/2020, Royal Decree-Law 10/2020 and Royal Decree-Law 11/2020 —provide initial measures to address the coronavirus (COVID) crisis.

The legislation includes measures that address health and the economy at large, with a particular emphasis on the tourism industry, small and medium size enterprises (SMEs), and the self-employed, as well as persons affected by the containment measures.

These measures are at the national level, and they could be supplemented by measures at regional and local levels
